#### **6<sup>th</sup> Grade Required Core Courses**

All 6<sup>th</sup> grade students will receive a yearlong class in Math, Science, Language Arts, U.S. History, and Reading. Advanced coursework will be determined by 5<sup>th</sup> grade teacher recommendations and FSA performance on a separate course selection card. Any questions? #### **Advanced Coursework:**

- Courses will be rigorous and may require significant projects, writing assignments and work outside of class time.
- Placement is determined by past student performance. Criteria will include previous Level 4 on FSA Reading and/or Math, A average, high performance on district quarterly checks and advance math placement test as well as teacher recommendation. Notification of course placement and summer assignments will be made early summer.
- Summer assignments will support the beginning of the school year focus and can be accessed on the school website.
- Schedule changes will not be possible once enrolled due to class size mandates and end-of-course exam requirements.
