SUMMER ASSIGNMENTS

- Math 6-8/Algebra 1 Honors: Download on the RRMS Website.
- ELA 6-8: Read one Historical Fiction novel and one Sunshine State novel, and write a reflection/reading log for each.
- Social Studies (Advanced): The expectation is that students will be familiar with US Geography, landmarks and will also be preparing ideas for History Fair topics. Students should read through the website and have a topic in mind within the first two weeks of school.
- 1. National History Day Project
 - All advanced social studies students are required to complete a National History Day research project. In preparation for this, around mid-July, students should read through the NHD website (<u>https://www.nhd.org</u>) The final research project is usually due in January.
 - 2. The upcoming year's theme is Breaking Barriers. Based on the theme, students should generate a list of at least three topics they would be interested in researching. The themes are chosen to be broad enough to encourage investigation of topics ranging from local history to world history, and from ancient time to the recent past. To understand the historical importance of your topic you need to ask questions about time, place and context; cause and effect; change over time; and impact and significance. You must consider not only when and where events happened, but also why they occurred and what factors contributed to their development.
 - 3. Students should also be thinking about which type of medium (website, exhibit, research paper, performance or documentary) they would like to present their research in.
 - 4. Reading through the website and looking at examples of material is the best way to have a handle on this project. Most of the work will be completed outside of class.
