This event is intended to help new Royals learn the lay of the land, meet administrators, counselors and teachers, and explore the exciting opportunities to get involved, stay connected, and safe in the new school year! Both students and parents are invited to attend the event together during the selected two-hour orientation window. **Before coming on campus, you should complete the Know Before You Go in MyStudent Parent Portal.**

You should start in the CAFETERIA where schedules will be available for new students only. Those who have paid their fees online will have an express line with no waiting. You can also pick up all pre-purchased items like workbooks and spirit items. Each 6th grader and new student will be given a free RRMS spirit pack to welcome them to the castle at this time.

**8:15AM, 9:15AM, 10:15AM, 11:15AM: Informational Meeting About the New Year/Transitioning to RRMS with Administration and Counselors: THEATER:** Middle school is the most important time to stay connected to your child's progress as they transition with independence. Learn about the exciting opportunities and expectations at RRMS for the 2022-23 school year. This presentation will include how to stay connected and informed as a new Royal family, campus expectations, academic opportunities, clubs and sports participation requirements and more. Learn how to access myPascoConnect for online textbooks and other applications, myStudent to monitor grades and attendance, PBIS Rewards, which is our school-wide positive behavior incentive program and a variety of other digital communication tools. School counselors and administrators will be available at this session.

**Conquer the Castle Interactive Campus Tour:** After picking up your schedule/paying fees, etc. at the Welcome/Pick up in the CAFETERIA, walk the campus to see where classes will be and become familiar with the campus prior to the first day! This will help to ease those first day jitters by mapping the safest and fastest path to classes. There will be interactive QR Codes at each location introducing the staff and important details of the location. Find important locations like the front office, clinic, student services, cafeteria, media, and gymnasium. There will be plenty of Royal Knights to help you find your way!

Log in to your parent portal to download and print your child's middle school class schedule. Bring it with you when you attend the event. You can use this to explore our campus on a self-guided tour, visit the sessions, and pick up your pre-purchased items. It is highly recommended that you print your schedule at home. There will be tables in the media center to pick up pre-purchased items only. **For incoming 6th graders and new students attending Storm the Castle, schedules will be available in the CAFETERIA but it is highly recommended that you pay fees and print your schedule prior to the event. For returning 7th and 8th graders, you will need to pay fees and print your schedule prior to the event.**

Individual teachers update grades periodically. Their timeline for entering grades may be daily, weekly, or twice per grading period - depending on their course. ## HEALTH REQUIREMENTS & CLINIC INFO

All Pasco County students are required to be fully immunized. Students who are missing required immunizations will be unable to receive their schedules on Storm the Castle/Open House Days. **Parents need to go on myStudent Parent Portal to complete the emergency card prior to Storm the Castle or Open House Day.**

**Students are NOT allowed to carry ANY medications while at school.** This includes prescription medications, over-the-counter medications, and medicines from health food stores. A student may carry an asthma inhaler with written permission from a doctor and a parent. All other medications that are scheduled to be administered during school hours MUST be stored in the clinic along with a signed parental form.

**Healthy Student Program:** Paperwork available on the website or in this newsletter. Please return to the clinic.

- Management of acute illness or injury and the administration of limited medications, following physician guidelines and protocols (i.e. ibuprofen, Tylenol, Motrin, Robitussin, Tums, and antifungal ointment, Benadryl, hydrocortisone, etc.).
- Observation and follow up re: communicable diseases (i.e. pink eye, ringworm, etc.).
- A health professional will communicate with you about your child's particular health findings that may require an evaluation, follow up or referral.

Questions about health requirements, medications, and other health services may be directed to our school nurse, Ms. Leah Janssen at [ljanssen@pasco.k12.fl.us](mailto:ljanssen@pasco.k12.fl.us). Parents can make an appointment for the week of August 8th to drop off medications, etc. by contacting Ms. Noe at [jnoe@pasco.k12.fl.us](mailto:jnoe@pasco.k12.fl.us). All forms (parent permission to administer, medical management plans) are on the RRMS website under Clinic.

**7<sup>th</sup> GRADE TDAP REQUIREMENT:** All 7<sup>th</sup> graders must have their TDAP shot up to date and bring proof of vaccination prior to entering school. Florida Certification of Immunization (DH680 form) must be provided to the school nurse on August 5th and prior to the first day of school. **Students who do not have the TDAP may not start school. All Pasco County students are required to be fully immunized.**

## SCHOOL SUPPLIES

School supply lists are posted on the RRMS website and included at the end of this newsletter. There is also the option of purchasing school supply boxes through [www.schooltoolbox.com](http://www.schooltoolbox.com) that will ship directly to your home. A portion of the proceeds from the School ToolBox supplies will come back to RRMS to be used for student and staff recognition. Students are HIGHLY RECOMMENDED to carry their own personal hand sanitizer, bring their own earbuds, calculator, water bottle and electronic device such as a laptop, tablet or iPad. Teachers will provide additional needs during the first week of school.

## SCHEDULE CHANGES

There will be no schedule changes completed at Storm the Castle/Meet the Teacher-Open House on 8/5. You may make a request online only. The Assistant Principal for Scheduling and the guidance staff will review requests for schedule changes according to the following guidelines:

- Student has already taken the course;
- Student has not completed the prerequisite;
- Student needs the course to be promoted to high school.

Due to Class Size Amendment, no other requests for schedule changes will be honored. If your scheduling request meets the above criteria, please visit the link on the RRMS website.

## PHYSICAL EDUCATION UNIFORMS

Students taking Physical Education or Dance courses will be able to dress out and use the locker rooms this year. Locks can be purchased for \$9 on Rycor at Storm the Castle/Open House on July 28<sup>th</sup> and August 5<sup>th</sup> or the first week of school.

We do recommend the purchase of PE uniforms for \$10 shirt or shorts or a combo for \$15. Dance uniforms are available for purchase for \$30 for a shirt and leggings. These items will be available on July 28<sup>th</sup> and August 5<sup>th</sup>, and the first few weeks of school for purchase.

## SAFETY DRILLS

Central to having a safe school is practicing emergency drills during the school day. Fire drills will be conducted during the first two weeks of school and monthly thereafter, in accordance with state law. A tornado drill will also be scheduled in September and again in the spring. An Active Threat Plan (ATP) drill is conducted each quarter. These drills allow staff and students to rehearse the procedures that may be needed in the event of an emergency situation.

## ASBESTOS NOTIFICATION

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has issued a final rule, 40 CFR Part 763, Asbestos Containing Material in Schools, commonly referred to as AHERA. This rule requires all Local Education Agencies (LEA's) to identify asbestos containing materials (ACM) in their school buildings and to take appropriate actions to control the release of asbestos fibers. All inspections for River Ridge Middle/High School have been completed and a Management Plan describing the results of the inspection and the action plan to control any asbestos found during the inspections, where applicable, has been submitted to the Governor for approval. Copies of this plan are located in the administrative office of the school and at the District School Board of Pasco County Maintenance/Facility Operations Department. The report is available for review upon request.

All middle school students may participate in the middle school athletic program. Students must have a valid physical form submitted prior to tryouts. Please visit the RRMS website under Athletics for all required paperwork. Upon making the team, the following athletic participation fees apply and must be paid within 3 days of making the team:

- **Athletic Participation Fee:** \$50 1<sup>st</sup> sport, \$30 2<sup>nd</sup> sport;  
Family cap per school \$130, Individual cap \$80

## GoFAN.CO DIGITAL TICKETING

All athletic tickets must be purchased on GoFan.co. We will not sell tickets at the gates. All middle school sports tickets will be \$5.

For each game, if you have purchased a season pass on GoFan.co, you will be guaranteed admission to all HOME athletic events. This All-Access Pass entitles the holder to claim a single ticket for each River Ridge home game for the 2022-23 season. \*\*This pass is not valid for FHSAA State Series events. Season passes are \$55.

Senior Citizens – We will hold back a limited number of senior citizen tickets up until game time. At that point, they will be released to the general public.

Free Admission passes (PCSB Employees, FHSAA passes) – We will hold back a limited number of tickets up until game time.

Under school-age children will still be let in free with parents (up to capacity).

# SECURITY

### BAG PROCEDURE

Only bags that are clear plastic and/or vinyl, Ziploc bags, small clutch-type purses no larger than 4 inches by 6 inches, diaper bags, and medically necessary items are permitted inside an event venue. No other bags of ANY kind are permitted, except for properly credentialed school and professional photographers' camera bags.

ALL BAGS ARE SUBJECT TO SEARCH UPON ENTRY.

### PROHIBITED ITEMS

- Firearms, weapons of any kind, knives
- Any item that could be used as a missile
- Fireworks
- Aerosol cans (pump and spray bug spray and sunscreen are allowed)
- Coolers, glass
- Recreational balls, horns, lasers
- Camera, computer, binoculars cases
- Illegal drugs, alcoholic beverages of any kind

- Pets (exceptions will be made for service animals)
- Sticks/poles/camera "selfie" sticks/extendors or gimbals
- Unmanned Aircraft Systems/drones and radio controlled model aircraft
- Food and drinks not purchased at the venue (sealed non-alcoholic beverages are allowed to be brought in by ticketed ADULTS only).

### PATRON CODE OF CONDUCT

Students are expected to abide by the Pasco County Schools Student Code of Conduct. When attending a game, you are required to refrain from the following behaviors:

1. Behavior that is unruly, disruptive or illegal in nature
2. Intoxication or other signs of alcohol impairment that results in irresponsible behavior
3. Foul or abusive language or obscene gestures
4. Interference with the progress of the game (including throwing objects onto the field)
5. Failing to follow instructions of school officials
6. Verbal or physical harassment of opposing team fans

Event patrons are responsible for their conduct as well as the conduct of their guests. Event patrons and guests who violate these provisions will be subject to ejection without refund and loss of ticket privileges for future games.

No re-entry if a patron leaves, and no entry or ticket sales after 3/4 of any event has expired.

## VOLUNTEER INFORMATION

Parents and community members can apply online to become an approved volunteer after July 1st. A new application must be completed each year. The application can be accessed on our district website <http://www.pasco.k12.fl.us> and must be renewed each year. The link is located on the main page, entitled "Volunteer Application." Volunteers are still subject to a state criminal background check and a sexual predator/offender check. Our school's volunteer coordinator, Sue Hammelman, can advise you of your approval status once you have submitted your application. ## MS PROMOTION REQUIREMENTS

The state mandate (**F.S. 1003.4156**) requires that middle school students complete a Language Arts, Math, Science, & Social Studies course each year with a minimum grade of "D" as well as a career component to be promoted to high school (as a part of World History/Health class through myLearning). Middle School students must also sit for the State Civics Assessment.

## DISTRICT REQUIRED MS ASSESSMENTS

**District Finals:** These finals will be given at the end of each year/semester for courses without state assessments. They will count as 10% of the student's semester grade. The testing window is Dec. 11-17 and May 15-26.

**State Assessments & EOCs:** These assessments will take place in April and May to measure student progress and proficiency of the grade level standards.

- FAST ELA Reading/Writing 6-8 (3x per year)
- FAST Math 6-8, Algebra I EOC, Geometry EOC
- FCAT NGSSS Science Grade 8 (and students in Physical Science/Accl. Science Honors 7<sup>th</sup> Grade)
- Civics EOC – 30% of the student's year-long grade

### **WHAT IS A TARDY?**

When a student is not physically inside the classroom door when the bell rings.

### **WHAT DO I DO IF I AM TARDY?**

Immediately report to the front office. You will be issued a pass. If tardies and attendance become excessive, consequences may follow including but not limited to Lonely Lunch, After School Detention, etc.

### **STUDENTS MAY NOT BE IN THE HALLWAYS WITHOUT A PASS.**

### **WHERE IS THE DRESS CODE POLICY LOCATED?**

On our RRMS website, in your planner, and posted throughout campus.

### **WHAT DO I DO IF I AM OUT OF DRESS CODE?**

A staff member will send you to Student Services to log in for a Dress Code violation.

### **DOES DRESS CODE RESET?**

Yes. Each quarter dress code resets.

### **WHAT ARE THE CONSEQUENCES FOR DRESS CODE?**

- 1) Warning & Change Clothes
- 2) Change Clothes, Parent Contact, Ineligible to participate in extracurricular activities
- 3) Each subsequent violation will result in student being required to change and serve ISS/ineligible to participate in extracurricular activities.
- 4) Acts of defiance and argumentative behavior could result in more severe consequences, including OSS.

### **WHEN ARE WIRELESS COMMUNICATION DEVICES PROHIBITED?**

Possession of a WCD by a student at school during school hours and/or during extracurricular activities is a privilege that may be forfeited by any student who fails to abide by the terms of this policy, or otherwise abuses this privilege. The use of any WCD in classrooms from non-education related communications or purposes is prohibited. Using a WCD to capture or record/transmit pictures of others without their consent is prohibited. Using a WCD in locker rooms, shower facilities, or restrooms is prohibited. Using a WCD to capture or record/transmit/receive test information constituting fraud, theft, or academic dishonesty is prohibited.

### **WHEN CAN I USE A WIRELESS COMMUNICATION DEVICE?**

Lunch, before and after school, passing, after school activities, on the school bus, and when a classroom teacher allows you to use it for an instructional activity.

### **CAN A STAFF MEMBER CONFISCATE MY WIRELESS COMMUNICATION DEVICE?**

Yes. Refusing to hand over your WCD is defiance of authority. You will automatically receive a Discipline Referral and may result in OSS.

### **WHAT ARE THE CONSEQUENCES FOR INAPPROPRIATE USE OF A WCD?**

- 1) Confiscation, student pick-up at the end of the period
- 2) Confiscation, student pick-up at the end of the day
- 3) Confiscation, parent/guardian pick-up
- 4) Confiscation, parent/guardian pick up, 3 days Lonely Lunch
- 5) Confiscation, parent/guardian pick up, Discipline Referral

\*Note: Administration may create a check in, check out and/or WCD student behavior agreement that will limit/eliminate WCD use, if deemed necessary.

# ***DRESS CODE***

In order to promote an orderly learning environment in our schools while preparing all students for later success in the world of work, the District School Board of Pasco County has established the following guidelines for student dress:

- ✓ The principal, or designee, shall determine the appropriateness of dress and appearance in accordance with the guidelines distributed by the school, school board policy and guidelines contained herein. The principal, or designee, will make the decision if a student's appearance meets school and community standards. The principal's decision on the appropriateness of dress is final as long as it does not contradict official district policy listed herein or elsewhere.
- ✓ These guidelines are in effect while on any District School Board of Pasco County school or campus, at any school function or on any school-sponsored transportation.
- ✓ Students are prohibited from wearing clothing that exposes underwear or body parts in an indecent or vulgar manner or that disrupts the learning environment (F.S. 1006.07).

**These guidelines are in effect while on any District School Board of Pasco County school or campus, at any school function or on any school-sponsored transportation.**

- Students must wear clothing that has fabric in the front, back and on the sides (under the arms) and shoes.
- Shirts and dresses must have fabric in the front, back and on the sides (under the arms).
- Shirts must have straps.
- Clothing must cover undergarments (this includes straps and waistbands).
- Fabric covering chests, genitals and buttocks must be opaque.
- Clothing must be suitable for all scheduled classroom activities including physical education, science labs, wood shop and other activities where unique hazards exist.
- Specialized courses may require specialized attire, such as sports uniforms or safety gear.

**The following types of clothing, items, accessories and apparel are considered inappropriate for the school environment:**

- Any clothing that exposes underwear, body parts and/or skin in an indecent or vulgar manner.
- Any clothing that substantially disrupts the school environment or causes safety concerns.
- Any clothing that depicts profanity, drugs, violent images or vulgarity in any form.
- Any clothing that depicts sexually implicit or explicit images.
- Any clothing that depicts gang-related images, indicates gang affiliation or antisocial group affiliation.
- Wallet chains, spiked jewelry, dog collars or similar items.
- Slippers or similar shoes.
- Pajamas or costumes (unless approved by school administration for special events, etc.).
- Hats, bandanas, or head coverings (unless preapproved administratively for medical, religious reasons and/or for special school activities)

Wearing clothing or accessories that depict a firearm or weapon or express an opinion regarding a right guaranteed by the Second Amendment to the United States Constitution is not grounds for disciplinary action or referral to the criminal justice or juvenile justice system under this section or F.S. 1006.13.

### **Regulations Regarding the Wearing of Items and/or Clothing that Conceal Identity**

- A student's identity must be readily recognizable by school staff at all times, during the school-day, or when the student is engaged in a school-sponsored activity.
- No items or clothing, or any combinations of such, may be worn in a manner that conceals the wearer's face. Face coverings such as ski masks, gas masks, Halloween masks, costume masks, ninja masks, pantyhose, full face masks, hoods (including hoods from sweatshirts or jackets commonly referred to as "hoodies") or other face coverings that obstruct a wearer's vision or face or identity are not allowed absent a legally protected right that has been approved in writing by the school's Principal or the District's Equity Officer.
- Students may utilize an appropriate face-covering (such as a medical mask, surgical mask, scarf, bandanna, fishing buff, and other items made of a suitable and safe material that will cover the wearer's nose and mouth and prevent or reduce the release of respiratory droplets from the wearer's mouth or nose) for the purposes of health-related concerns.
- Student's must comply with the directive of all school staff members to remove any and all items or clothing set forth above so that the student's identity can be readily revealed and recognized. This would include the temporary removal of an appropriate face covering being utilized for health concerns so that a student's identity can be confirmed.
- During times of inclement weather, a Principal, may modify or suspend application of these provisions when doing so is in the best interest of the student body's health, safety, and welfare.
- Failure to comply with the above policy and provisions may result in disciplinary action as detailed herein and/or elsewhere in district policy.

### **Students in violation of the dress code:**

- Will be required to change into appropriate clothing, contacting the parent/guardian as needed.
- Students may be required to remain in the front office until the above condition is met per principal discretion.
- May receive a discipline referral and receive consequences as appropriate for repeated breaches of the policy.

**First Offense:** The student shall be given a verbal warning and the school principal or designee shall call the student's parent or guardian.

**Second Offense:** The student is ineligible to participate in any extracurricular activity for a period of time not to exceed 5 days and the school principal or designee shall meet with the student's parent or guardian.

**Third or Repeated Offense:** The student shall receive an in-school suspension for a period not to exceed 3 days, the student is ineligible to participate in any extracurricular activity for a period not to exceed 30 days, and the school principal or designee shall call the student's parent or guardian and send the parent or guardian a written letter regarding the student's in-school suspension and ineligibility to participate in extracurricular activities. (F.S. 1006.07, 1003.01)

## EARLY RELEASE DAYS

During the 2022-23 school year, Pasco County Schools will continue the implementation of a monthly, two-hour early release schedule. Early Release days will be on the following days: 9/7, 10/5, 11/2, 12/7, 1/11, 2/1, 3/1, 4/12. There will be no early release days in May. We will also run Club Days Activity Schedule on these days. Students will select a club for each semester to attend during this time. Early Release days allow for staff to engage in professional development aligned to student needs and district and school priorities. We are confident that this additional learning time for teachers will increase effective instruction and lead to higher student achievement. Another benefit is that teachers will not have to complete professional development during student class time, thereby decreasing the requirement for substitutes. Bus transportation will be provided two hours earlier than usual for students who are transported on regular school days. The same routes and stops will be used. School will be released at 11:30AM each early release day and there will be no practice or after school activities on these dates.

**HEALTHY STUDENT PROGRAM APPLICATION FORM 2022-2023**

Dear Parent:

Your child is eligible for enrollment in the **Healthy Student Program**, available only at ***selected schools*** (*only administered by clinic assistant or school nurse*) in the district where there are extended nursing services. **Healthy Student Program** services are offered at no direct cost to you and all students are eligible, regardless of insurance.

The main purpose of the **Healthy Student Program** is to **improve school attendance** and to **reduce health problems** that occur during the school day. A student may be withdrawn from the **Healthy Student Program** at any time by the parent or the school health services staff with written notice.

The Healthy Student program is the commitment of the Pasco County School District and is intended as an effort to help students remain in school, ready to learn. Services available to students enrolled in the **Healthy Student Program** may include:

- **Management of acute illness or injury and the administration of limited medications**, following physician guidelines and protocols (i.e. ibuprofen, Tylenol, Motrin, Robitussin, Tums, and antifungal ointment, Benadryl, hydrocortisone, etc.).
- **Observation and follow up re: communicable diseases** (i.e. pink eye, ringworm, etc.).
- **A health professional will communicate with you** about your child's particular health findings that may require an evaluation, follow up or referral.
- **Physical Examinations** (ARNP services) for school entry, sports, etc. may be available at limited school sites.
- **Lab screenings** (hematocrit/hemoglobin, anemia, blood glucose, urinalysis, and pregnancy testing) may be available at limited school sites.

Please inform the school nurse of any newly diagnosed health conditions for your child or changes in health status during the school year.

**The primary goal of school health services is to support academic success by maintaining the physical and mental wellbeing of your child.**
